STUDENT SUPPORT AND SUCCESS

- » **Scholarships** for student veterans enable students to complete their degree, even after they have exhausted their GI Bill benefits.
- » Providing military-connected students with grants and scholarships for research support, conference travel and academic support provide professional development opportunities they need to succeed.
- » **Transitional support programs** ensure student veterans receive quality peer, academic and professional assistance.
- » A full-time academic and career coach manages internship opportunities and career and networking events for military-connected students, while developing more robust peer, academic and professional programs.
- » Short-term loans help alleviate the financial burden for student veterans and military dependents whenever VA housing benefits are delayed.
- » Student veterans are more likely to have childcare needs while enrolled in classes. Childcare subsidies help these student parents meet their childcare needs and focus on their studies.
- » Capital improvements to our facilities ensure the long-term accessibility of not just our spaces, but also our services and resources that benefit our military students.
- » Some veterans suffer from undiagnosed injuries, impairments or learning disabilities. **Diagnostic testing** could help them secure the accommodations they may be eligible for and ensure they are successful in school.
- » **Financial support to pay for alternative health and wellness treatments** could help student veterans get relief from symptoms that have not responded to traditional health treatments.
